God's Gift of Time



YOU ARE A PASSION OF CHRIST!

Want to know someone? Find out what he or she loves. So what is Jesus passionate about? It's simple – He is passionate about you. Not humanity in general, but you. When Jesus looked at the crowds, He didn't see a blur of faces. He saw each person—knew them, loved them. The Crucifix and the Eucharist aren't just symbols; they're proof that His love goes to staggering lengths to be with us and bless us. It's a love so personal and intense, it demands a response. So how do we respond?

Start simple: "Thank you. I love you." We assume people know we love them, but it still matters to say it out loud. The same is true of Jesus. In His appearances to St. Margaret Mary and later to St. Faustina, He shared how deeply wounded He is by indifference and ingratitude, especially in the Eucharist. He also promised immense grace to those who console Him with love, thanks, and attention.

Come to the Feast. At every Mass, Jesus gives everything—His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1374). He gives us His whole Heart, hoping we'll give ours in return. He is as present now as He was at the Last Supper. Simply showing up to be with Him is an act of love — and a bold act of faith.

Receive His Mercy. When we come to Him in Confession, genuinely sorry, He doesn't scold—He celebrates. Not because of our sin, but because He gets to pour out His mercy. "Souls that make an appeal to My mercy delight Me" (Diary of St. Faustina, 1146). **Confession doesn't just free your soul—it fills His Heart with joy.**

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love" (John 15:9).

You are Peter; and I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of heaven.

Family Connection

In today's Gospel, Jesus refers to Peter as "Rock" and says that the Church will be built upon him. We refer to someone as a "rock" when they are very reliable. Talk as a family about who has been and is a rock in your extended family.


The Gospel reminds us that the Church is built on the foundation of faith in Jesus Christ. It is faith that makes Peter the Rock upon which the Church is built. The family, as the domestic Church, has this same faith as its foundation.

Talk about people whose faith has helped you to be a member of the Church and talk about what you have learned from leaders in our Church today. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 16:13-20. Talk about what you know about Peter and his importance to the early Christian community. Talk about what we can learn from Peter and his profession of faith about Jesus. Conclude in prayer together by praying today's Psalm or an Act of Faith.

Saint Joseph Church Food Pantry

The Food Pantry is a service organization at Saint Joseph Church in Makawao, Maui. It serves to provide food to families and single people on Maui especially in the upcountry communities.

The Food Pantry has a drive through distribution every 3rd Thursday of each month from 8:00 AM to 10 AM at the Makawao entrance to the church parking lot. Each household receives one bag of groceries and one bag of fresh vegetables and/or frozen items. Households with 4 or more member receives two bags of groceries and two bags of fresh vegetables and/or frozen items. Clients need to register with the Food Pantry to qualify when they receive their food items for the first time.

Food items are from The Maui Food Bank and generous donations from parish members and others in the community. Any food donations are welcome and can be left in the food donation bin at the entrance of the church. Food items accepted are canned fruits, meats, soup and beans and vegetables. Also cereal, and juice are welcome.

The Food Pantry welcomes any volunteers to be stewards on food distribution days. You may contact leaders **Judy Cambra** and **Frieda Inciong** at **808 572-0337**.

In his encyclical letter, Laudato Si', Pope Francis encourages "care for creation through little daily actions" and "changes in lifestyle," for example, through "avoiding the use of plastic and paper, reducing water consumption, separating refuse, cooking only what can reasonably be consumed, showing care for other living beings, using public transport or car-pooling, planting trees, turning off unnecessary lights, or any number of other practices" (Laudato Si', no. 211).

"The commitment to be a follower of Jesus Christ is expressed not in a single action, or even in a number of actions over a period of time, but in an entire way of life." – Introduction to the pastoral letter Stewardship: A Disciples Response.
